# A Note from the Pastor

A new year brings resolutions! With each 'new' start, we hope to set different expectations, build better habits, and create space that might lead to more happiness. While I have never scribbled any list on paper in previous years, I have resolved to work on myself and many of those years held lackluster results and waning commitment to my absent list. But, this 'hinge-point' of a new year allows us to reflect and potentially make meaningful

changes. So, here are some things I'd ask you to consider if you are making your resolution list for 2025:

**Practice proximity.** Practice proximity with God through prayer and bible study. Be intentional in growing your faith practices in 2025. Practice proximity with neighbor, too. Make an effort to get to know someone new each week - especially if they don't look like you.

**Deepen family ties and time.** Family looks different for each person. So, no matter if you are connected by blood, faith, or decision—spend intentional time with YOUR family, no matter what that looks like. Hug them. Forgive them. Share food with them. Digital time and presence on phones, tablets, and social media are much less valuable than genuine relationships.

**Add a practice of service.** I am convinced that service is the heart of the gospel, so find some way to serve in this community. It could be behind the scenes or up front, but practice giving yourself away in 2025.

Consider and grow your capacity for generosity. We cannot grow our capacity for generosity until we measure how we're doing with it now. Step back and consider how generous you are. What do you need to change? How could your generosity grow in 2025? While resolving to eat more vegetables, work out more, and spend less time on your phone might be good, I'm convinced investing in the list above might just unlock more depth and faith than you might ever imagine. Jesus taught his disciples in John 13, "34 give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." May we seek to love and serve all who surround us in 2025 so they'll know who we follow!

### A Flood Is Coming... Noye's Fludde, a Church Opera, to Be Presented in March 2025

Nove's Fludde (Noah's Flood) is coming to FBC Greenwood March 13 and 14. 2025. This community church opera. written by the British composer Benjamin Britten, will be performed in our sanctuary. This wonderful large-scale work employs two Metropolitan Opera singers, a Broadway actor, youth roles, lots of children as animals, dancers, orchestra, sets and costumes... and YOU. The audience sings three hymn tunes throughout the performance. This is a gigantic undertaking, and we are delighted to bring this work to Greenwood and the Upstate for the first time. The Foundation has FBC araciously underwritten this special event. The performances will be free and open to the public. Our children from Music Makers and Young Musicians and our youth, along with children from area churches, schools, and the entire community, plus students attending Lander University, will join together to perform the roles of Nove's family and the various animals that enter the ark. Two dancers will represent the raven and the dove. Broadway star Stacev Robinson returns to Greenwood to be the Voice of God, and Metropolitan Opera singers Kyle Pfortmiller and Kirstin Chavez will sing Noye and Noye's Wife. An orchestra consisting of strings, recorders, trumpets, organ, piano, handbells, and lots of percussion, including homemade instruments, will fill our sanctuary with the sounds of raindrops, rainstorms, seas, and the appearance of the rainbow, God's covenant with Noah and all people. Keith Jameson will conduct and Ellen Schlaefer from Opera at USC in Columbia, SC, will direct. I hope you will make plans to attend this amazing, special, and uplifting event in the life of our church and community! A Flood is coming... make your preparations!

Safe Sanctuary regulations require two adults or mature youth in each preschool room. Visitors who learn that FBC follows Safe Sanctuary guidelines know that FBC cares about the safety and well-being of their children. This means the parents are more likely to consider making FBC their church home. Preschoolers need developmentally appropriate activities, including opportunities to play. Preschoolers need room to move. Multiple Extended Session classes and Children's Church address the needs of preschoolers as they grow and develop. Extended Session/Children's Church depend on volunteers. Currently Ann needs adult Children's Church volunteers on the first Sunday of February, April, June, August, October, and December. Two Toddler Extended Session volunteers are needed for the fourth Sunday of these months as well.
