A Note from the Pastor



2025 will be an important year for First Baptist Church. I will encourage us to pause and pray two unifying prayers: "God, who do You want us to be?" and "God, what do You want us to do?" These prayers are not just words. They are a call to open our hearts and lift our eyes to the extraordinary plans God has for us.

Throughout Scripture, we see how God shows up in people's dreams. Joseph's story reminds us that dreams are not just figments of

imagination but vehicles for God's purpose. Joseph's dreams weren't easy to understand or follow initially, but they carried him through betrayal and hardship, and ultimately, he was put in a position to save countless lives. In the same way, we are called to seek God's dreams for our church, trusting that God's plans for us are good but might stretch our assumptions. The best dreams are transformative, after all.

What might God's dream for First Baptist Church look like? It begins with a willingness to listen and to trust. As we pray, "God, who do You want us to be?" we are asking God to shape our identity as God's people, individually and corporately. This could mean expanding current ministries, embracing new outreach opportunities, or supporting one another in ways we've never imagined.

It's easy to focus on the challenges and limitations we face—time, resources, and uncertainties. But God calls us to lift our eyes beyond what is and to look toward what could be. Just as Joseph's journey was marked by setbacks that ultimately led to triumph, our path may not always be easy. However, as faithful people, we trust that God will generously provide.

To dream together as a church is to step into a future that is bigger than ourselves. It means seeking God's guidance not just for individual lives but for our collective mission. It's about aligning our hearts with God's purposes and trusting that God will equip us for the work ahead.

Let us also remember that God's dreams require action. Faith is not passive; it moves us to respond. As we seek God's vision, let's commit to walking forward together in unity and hope. We are not alone on this journey. The same God who spoke to Joseph through dreams is with us, guiding and empowering us to align with God's work in the world.

So, First Baptist Church of Greenwood, let's dream together. Let's ask, seek, and knock, trusting that God will open doors we never thought possible. Let's lift our eyes and hearts to the One who has always been faithful. What dream has God prepared for us? Let's find out together.

A Flood is Coming... Noye's Fludde, Church Opera March 13 and 14

Our community church opera, Nove's Fludde, will be performed in the First Baptist Church sanctuary on Thursday, March 13 and Friday, March 14 at 6:00 pm each night. The opera lasts about an hour. It features children from FBC, other churches, and the Greenwood community. It also features two singers from the Metropolitan Opera, Stacey Robinson (Broadway performer and Greenwood native) as the Voice of God, Ellen Douglas Schlaefer, director (Opera at USC, Columbia, SC), and our own Keith Jameson as conductor. Lander University students, local musicians, and various people helping with sets, costumes, and other behind the scenes aspects will make this huge undertaking possible.

The English composer Benjamin Britten, composed this work to be premiered in June 1958 at the Aldeburgh Festival. Britten was keen to emphasize that the work needed to be performed in a church, not a concert hall or opera house. The work incorporates three hymns that are sung by the audience as well. Children and youth make up the largest part of the cast representing all sorts of animals and birds that make their way to the ark. There is a musical depiction of the Great Flood, with a homemade instrument representing the beginning of the raindrops. The "Slung-Mugs" are actually tea cups strung on a string, played by a wooden spoon, to depict the rain drops. Strings, trumpets, recorders, piano fourhands, organ, and handbells, all add to the dynamic colors of the orchestra.

I hope you will make plans to attend this major event in the life of our church and the Greenwood community. If you are willing to help with making animal headgear, sewing of costume pieces, or helping with sets or backstage with children, please contact Keith Jameson.
