The Advent and Christmas seasons are now history. k hope and pray that you found the worship and events as meaningful, worthwhile, and rich as I did. A huge "thank the Interim you" to the pastors, staff, and members who worked diligently to make it all happen.

First Baptist ended the year in a strong way. Some took my words seriously that the good news is that the church has the financial wherewithal needed to live out her mission, "Seeking His Heart . . . Being His Hands: Living, Loving, and Serving in the Name of Christ." The problem is that some of those resources were (and are) still in our purses, wallets, and bank accounts. The challenge to be faithful in our stewardship does not end with the calendar year. We are in a new year that affords us new challenges and blessings. I believe that FBC will rise to the challenge and experience God's blessings through strong stewardship of time, talents, and resources. Potential Senior Pastor candidates will look at your financial stewardship (and many other aspects of FBC's life) as one means of evaluating their interest in coming to serve alongside you. Additionally, Sunday School and worship attendance averages rose in 2023 over 2022. The increases were small but certainly good news. You did this during a whole year of transition. 2024 can be even stronger if you continue your good work.

First Baptist welcomed Lauren Coker as Interim Youth Leader. The Youth Committee and I have and will continue to work with Lauren enabling her to be successful in relating to and mentoring FBC's youth in the ways of the Lord.

The Pastor Search Committee is reviewing resumes. The committee is moving forward expeditiously. My experience with churches in the interim is that members want a new Senior Pastor yesterday. However, it takes time to listen to the Lord, to each other, and potential candidates. This is a holy discernment process. The committee wants and values your prayers and support. Please be patient with them. This diverse group is doing great work!

My role in the search for your next Senior Pastor. Once again, I want to reemphasize my limited role in the search process. I am available to provide help, suggestions, guidance, etc. to the Pastor Search Committee regarding process. I do not recommend or evaluate potential candidates. The church has called the twelve members of the search team to evaluate candidates and recommend the one to you that they believe God is calling to be your next Senior Pastor.

What the committee has done this week is to listen to sermons of these remaining potential candidates. The committee met following worship on Sunday, January 21, to determine if the committee can narrow the search even more. Once the committee does this work, then the committee will begin to plan for and engage in actual conversation with the remaining candidates. The committee ask that you continue to pray for the committee and for the person who will be the next Senior Pastor.



The Pilgrimage Begins Again: "Rend Your Heart"

In choosing music for the Lenten season. there are relatively few anthems specifically for Ash Wednesday. I was struck by reading a recent poem by Jan Richardson, titled "Rend Your Heart," that was written for Ash Wednesday, and I set about composing a new anthem. The piece is written for the Bell Tower Trio (David Corbitt, Lewis Walker, and myself, with Betty Walker on piano). It talks about the chambers of the heart, filled with your entire life - all the people vou have met, paths vou have taken or not taken, all the words you have spoken or not spoken, in love, in rage. As she writes: "It could take you days to wander these rooms. Forty, at least."

I set most of the work in C-minor, with the ending switching to C-major, making it "hopeful and uplifting" at the end much like our journey through Lent to Easter. There are dissonances along the way, between the voices, and with the piano. There are some moments that sound like chimes, and polytonal chords (chords from different keys 'played together' to give an all-encompassing sound')... only to lead to 'The One' that we return to: God; and the C-Major key... hopeful, uplifting. The final lines of the poem are:

And so let this be a season for wandering

For trusting the breaking

For tracing the tear that will return you to the One who waits, who watches,

Who works within the rending to make your heart whole.


