GOD'S GROAN

The Apostle Paul was being accused of caring for and loving people not like us. Those people not like us includes the vast majority of the population, doesn't it? Think about it. It's far easier to ignore, not like, and think less of others who are different from us. In this case, though, it was the Gentiles–you and me. We were the ones whom Paul was accused of caring for and loving. We were the outsiders.

As I once heard Fred Craddock say when speaking of the book of Romans, Paul had heard the groan of God over Rome. Paul understood the care of God for ALL, not just those like you and me! Paul was attempting to allay the fears of the Jewish Christians regarding the Gentile Christians. His goal was to bring these two wings of the church together. A portion of the Jewish Christian church looked down on the Gentiles. They couldn't be real Christians, could they? After all they were not true descendants of Abraham.

As we move through the Lenten season and begin to hope for and experience warmer weather and anticipate spring, let me ask you: Have you heard God's groan over Greenwood? If so, what have you heard? What have you heard in God's groan that calls you to invest yourself in caring for and loving those who are different from you and me? It's certainly not easy or natural for me. Sometimes I succeed, other times I fail spectacularly. I'm speaking here of genuine care, not a paternalistic, oppressive, inauthentic care that really is an expression of ones' belief that: I'm better than you, but I'll lower myself to "care" for you.

George Eliot, in one of her books wrote: McCarthy died today. He would have given his life for people who wouldn't give him the time of day. Jesus heard God's groan over creation and gave his life, and yes, for some who wouldn't give him the time of day. Have you heard God's groan over Greenwood? If so, how will you respond? If you haven't heard God's groan over Greenwood, what are you willing to do to begin identifying, listening to and for it, and responding redemptively to it? I firmly believe that if you really listen and respond to God's groan over Greenwood that this church will reach heights that she has never experienced or seen.

"Return to the Lord" and "Go with Us, Lord"

During this Lenten season, the Chancel Choir will be singing a new Call to Worship each week titled "Return to the Lord" by Karle Erickson. The tenors and basses offer an undulating motif of "return" over and over while the altos and sopranos sing the melody "Return to the Lord, for He is your God, He is gracious and merciful unto you. Return." It's a beautiful way to begin each Sunday of Lent, as we enter into worship each week, with a focused desire to return our hearts and minds to the Lord and to be still, listening for God's word and message.

Also, each week we will end our Lenten services with the 'Tallis Canon' "Go with Us, Lord," with music by the English composer Thomas Tallis. We will sing the hymn tune all together, and then begin a round (like "Row. Row. Row Your Boat") with the congregation on the pulpit side and in the balcony starting first, followed by the congregation on the lectern side, followed by the Chancel Choir. You can imagine the melody even continuing after we finish singing, to propel us into the world, spreading the good news of Christ's salvation for all. It calls on the Lord to guide us every day, and for the Holy Spirit to make us "Strong and true" that our lives "May be our gift to you (God)." May this year's Lenten journey be a time of returning our hearts and minds to God, and taking the message of Christ's love and forgiveness out into the world. each dav. Keith

Finishing the Year (2023) on a Positive Note...Financially!

Although First Baptist ended the year with a negative balance (\$78,684.61) as it relates to the annual Ministry Plan, the church ended the year with a *surplus* (\$28,411.00) related to revenue verses expenses.

This would not be possible without the generous contributions given by the First Baptist Church family in December. Thank you for your generosity to the annual Ministry Plan and to the ministries of First Baptist Church!

In fact, more than \$211,000.00 was given in December alone! To say this in another way, twenty-one percent of the annual Ministry Plan was given in the month of December. (Thirty-four percent of the Annual Ministry Plan was given in the Fourth Quarter.)



In a recent article in *Outreach Magazine*, Thom Rainer listed several Truths in Church Statistics. Before you look at the answers below, see how many you get correctly.

- 1) The greatest decline in churches comes from the decreasing attendance frequency of church members.
- 2) The median average worship attendance is 65.
- 3) Approximately 22% of church participants are under the age of 18.
- Sixty-eight percent of church members live within 15 minutes of their congregation's location.
- 5) Females account for a majority of active participants (56%) in churches.


Walk the Labyrinth during Lent
