



# From Our New Senior Pastor Shut Up And Run



a consistent workout regimen with a friend. I was as healthy as ever. That discipline, lifting weights at least three days per week and running two different days, kept me fit and happy. Early mornings, five days each week, were challenging, though. It was a struggle to get out of bed well before the sun thought about peeking its head above the horizon. But, there was a distinct payoff at the end of every run. I felt energized, accomplished, and ready for the day. Now, please do not mistake that one season of my life as the clearest picture of me as a runner. After two meniscus repairs, I have a doctor's excuse not to run unless someone is chasing me with a knife!

The image of running is essential, though. Paul's use of the image in 1 Corinthians 9:24 guides much of how Christians think about running a race. Paul said, "Do you not know that in a race, the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it." Misunderstanding Paul's point can be dangerous because too many are obsessed with winning. We know that in any race, only one runner wins. We thirst after winning so much that it can shape how we lose. In fact, too many of us are poor losers. Why participate if you're not going to be confident of a win? Paul urges us to prepare in the ways it takes to win. His point is not that only one Christian can succeed in spiritual pursuits or even that we are in a contest against brothers and sisters in Christ. Instead, Paul points to the effort and dedication exhibited by athletes. That kind of dedication and work is how we should prepare to pursue Christ.

So, as summer approaches, how will you choose rhythms that prepare your pursuit of Christ? Will you 'set an alarm' and make sure to show up and engage in community at First Baptist? Will you clothe yourself with patience and kindness amid all your relationships? Will you run wind sprints through holy Scripture, memorizing and imprinting verses on your hearts, producing endurance in difficult times? Will you practice prayer, building confidence even in the rocky or uneven steps you'll take in the weeks ahead? I promise, as you prepare, the payoff is worth the work! Energy, accomplishment, confidence, and readiness await!

Dr. Cleveland holds the Master of Music degree in Organ Performance from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and the Bachelor of Music degree in Sacred Music from Carson-Newman University in Jefferson City, Tennessee. His dissertation entitled Rhythmic Freedom in Mendelssohn's Six Organ Sonatas, focuses on rhythmic performance practice techniques in Felix Mendelssohn's Six Organ Sonatas, Opus 65. He is an active concert organist. He recently was the organist in the Illuminare presentation on Good Friday at First Presbyterian Church. Greenwood, and played the Thanksgiving service here at FBC this past year. We are excited and thrilled to welcome Will to our music ministry this summer.
