Deacon Qualifications

- Minimum age of 21
- Active church member
- Care and service of members and others
- Commitment to Christ
- Faithfulness in attendance
- Faithfulness in stewardship
- Personal moral integrity
- Provide example to congregation that points to Christ and Christ's Spirit of love for all persons
- Seek to promote understanding and unity among all persons and groups
- Support the formulation of sound policies by the church
- Support the ministries of First Baptist
- Work to find spiritual solutions to major problems that affect the spiritual health of the church

Duties of a Deacon

- Minister to the spiritual and religious needs of the church and its members
- Committed to personal spiritual growth through Bible Study, church activities, and the offering of one's gifts
- Attend monthly Diaconate meetings and other meetings as called
- Lead in welcoming visitors and members to worship services
- Assist with observance of Communion
- Assist in other pastoral duties and needed



A Note from the Pastor

In my sermon from June 16th, I encouraged each of us to take scripture seriously. I offered a list of ways we might practice imprinting scripture on our hearts, as Deuteronomy 6 describes. One of the practices was choosing a life verse. But what Is a life verse? A life verse is a Biblical verse or passage with significant meaning. Maybe it helped you through a difficult time or gave you great joy on a special occasion. Perhaps it was the first verse you memorized or a favorite of someone special in your family.

Living by your life verse is not about trying to fit or mold your verse into your own life but about allowing your verse to shape and guide your life. Deuteronomy reminds us that we are to remember God's words in our hearts and minds, write them down, teach them to our children, and talk about them at home or wherever we are. Your life verse should become part of who you are. Allow it to direct you in your daily life and give you courage and encouragement.

There are numerous benefits to choosing a life verse. In times of joy or sorrow, your life verse can bring you peace and comfort. It can serve as a guiding light in moments of decision-making. Incorporating your life verse into a special service can deepen its meaning for you and your family. As Deuteronomy suggests, your life verse can be proudly displayed in your home or office, serving as a testament to others. Your life verse can also open up opportunities for meaningful conversations with family and friends about your Christian journey.

My life verse is the Great Commission from Matthew 28: "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Those words have guided my life and ministry when I have lost my way. These verses have encouraged and challenged me when I needed them.

What verse or verses resonate with you? I encourage you to seek scripture and latch on to your life verse in July! If you are having trouble deciding, I have a great list of potential verses that might help guide your decision-making. Once you have chosen a life verse, share it with the ministerial staff. We'll begin to compile a list of FBC members and their verses. Let me know how I can help as you take the next step toward taking Scripture more seriously.



The Diaconate received a hopeful financial report in June. In the interest of reporting to the congregation, the Diaconate wanted the church family to know the following:

- 1) Gifts to the annual Ministry Plan during the month of May totaled \$73,234.00 with a budgeted monthly need of \$82.367.45 and actual expenses of \$69,770,40. Therefore. gifts to the Ministry Plan in May exceeded expenses by \$3,463.60.
- 2) Although the May finances showed an surplus of funds for the month, YTD gifts to the annual Ministry Plan were still behind by \$60,643.25.


While gifts to the annual Ministry Plan are down, it is never too late to give! Thank you in advance for your continued gifts to the annual Ministry Plan.


Sanctuary Christmas Decorations – "Christmas in July" Fund
