A Note from the Pastor

November 2024

Generosity, just like anything else we want to be excellent in, takes practice. In their work through Notre Dame University on generosity, Christian Smith and Hilary Davidson said, "Generosity is the virtue of giving good things to others freely and abundantly. It is a learned character trait that involves attitude and action, entailing both the inclination and actual practice of giving liberally. It is not a haphazard behavior but a basic orientation to life. What generosity gives can vary:

money, possessions, time, attention, aid, encouragement, and more, but it always intends to enhance the true well-being of the receiver. Like all virtues, generosity is in people's genuine enlightened self-interest to learn and practice."

Ephesians 2:8–10 says, "It is by grace that you are saved through faith, not by anything of your own, but by a pure gift from God, and not by anything you have achieved. Nobody can claim the credit. You are God's work of art."

Grace, as an expression of God's limitless love, forms the central theme of scripture. Grace represents divine generosity that is given freely and unconditionally, constantly available to all, though often unnoticed or even rejected. Grace is the "new life" that shares in God's divine purpose. However, while many may grasp this concept intellectually, fewer have genuinely experienced it, leading to a lack of deep belief in its transformative power.

In the parable of the watchful servants from Luke 12:35–40, Jesus presents an extraordinary image of God that defies traditional expectations. God is portrayed not only as a servant waiting on us, even in the dark hours of the night but also as a divine burglar who breaks through the regularness of life. It illustrates God's persistent, even disruptive, efforts to reach us gracefully. God's grace is unrelenting in its pursuit of all humanity, breaking through barriers and expectations to bring each of us to a closer relationship.

Understanding God's unmerited grace, this "unaccountable love," is crucial to interpreting the Bible's more profound message. Without recognizing the radical nature of grace, the Bible can be misinterpreted as a set of rules, obligations, or judgments rather than a message of God's love and generosity. Grace cannot be earned, lost, or manipulated according to human standards of merit or achievement. Instead, it is God's continuous act of self-giving, a pure expression of love, that sustains not only human lives but all of creation. As Richard Rohr so eloquently states, "It is God eternally giving away God—for nothing, except the giving itself. I believe grace is what makes flowers bloom, animals lovingly raise their young, babies smile, and planets remain in their orbits—for no good reason whatsoever except love alone." Grace is a force of love that permeates everything, given freely, with no motive other than love itself.

As we make our way through November, how can the unmerited grace of God draw us towards generosity in our own lives? How can we make generosity, not haphazard behavior but our basic orientation to life?

We thank God for those family members and friends who have gone on before us...these magnificent Saints who are now glorifying God in heaven and watching over us all. On All Saints Sunday we reflect on "Oh how glorious is the kingdom in which all the saints rejoice with Christ" with a beautiful and moving anthem by Fred Gramann, with handbells and a chant-like theme. The remainder of November will be a focus on stewardship. and again we thank God for the abundant goodness that He has bestowed on our lives. We thank God for the opportunity to give to the community and world around us. The Chancel Choir will be singing Treasures a favorite anthem, which incorporates Give Me Jesus. We also feature two new anthems for the choir -Consider the Birds Above, an exquisitely beautiful work for choir, organ, and oboe, with Becky Gardner playing. Words are by Stephen Starke, music by Daniel Zager, with a setting by Bret Heim. A simple hymn-like melody is interspersed with lush harmonies, and a soaring descant in the oboe, under the calmness of the organ accompaniment. A couple of the verses are:


Never Grow Old (NGO) Fellowship
